There are many questions in regards to outdoor burning in the Borough, please refer to the Borough website to review any/all ordinances in effect. If you travel with your pet please do not leave them in your vehicle on a warm day, the inside vehicle temperature will rise quickly and leave pets very uncomfortable until you return.

As was written in the last newsletter, please pay attention to your homes and neighborhoods if you see anything that looks suspicious or out of place contact the Police Department and allow us to check on your concerns. We also provide vacation security checks of your residence, if interested please contact the Police Department.

And finally the emergency number for the Borough of Walnutport is 911, if you have a non-emergency please use 610-437-5252 to contact the Police Department. And lastly the 610 767-1134 number is for administrative purposes this number should not be used to report a crime or criminal activity.



MEDICATION DROP-OFF BOX



As reported in the last newsletter the Police Department secured a medication drop-off box, this is a cooperative program sponsored through Northampton County. The drop-off box is conveniently located in the hallway of Borough Hall near the Police Department entrance.

The Walnutport Authority now has a web page where public notices, water quality reports and contact information with office hours and location are listed. You can visit this site at www.walnutportauthority.org

Copies of the most recent Consumer Confidence Report (water quality report) is available on the Authority web site, in the Authority office or by calling 610-767-7887.

A reminder on Authority billing and collection policy: All bills are mailed quarterly (every three months), and it is the responsibility of the customer to notify the Authority if they have not received a bill. The same policy stands for payments lost in the mail, as the Authority cannot exonerate customers' bills of late fees because of possible mishandling by the postal service. The Authority does have an afterhours drop box located outside of the main entrance to our building. We ask you to identify your payment with "water and/or sewer" to insure proper handling of your payment.

The Authority asks all residents to have their water meter readout clear for meter readers to access. Keep all bushes and plants trimmed or away from this area. Please consider this when installing fencing or shrubbery and call our office at 610-767-7887, if you are not sure where your water meter readout is located.



Pamphlets are available in the Authority office on how to conserve water and ideas on using water efficiently.

A NOTE FROM THE SECRETARY/TREASURER'S OFFICE



A friendly reminder when paying for your garbage service please make the check payable to the Borough of Walnutport. You can save a stamp by dropping off your payment in our after hour box located outside our front door or stopping in our office during our office hours. We only accept cash or check...for now. We are looking into accepting credit cards in the future but don't want to cost the tax payers more money. Reminder about the after hour box and your due date...we must receive your payment in the office by 4:00 pm on the due date. If you place your payment in the after hour box on the due date it will be considered late. Our office hours are Monday – Friday from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm.


A NOTE FROM THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ERIC STROHL

Ordinance 2012-08 section 425-24 plowing and/or blowing or throwing snow.

“During such time a snow-removal condition, as described elsewhere in this article, exists, it shall be illegal for any person, firm, organization or entity to deposit snow into any street of this Borough, whether by the use of a snow blower, or by shoveling, or in any other manner, so as to constitute a safety hazard or to require the duplication of efforts of the Borough employees to clear the streets or alleys of the Borough of snow. It shall be unlawful for any citizen to plow and/or remove snow from the cartway of any Borough roads and/or streets whether by use of a plow, snow blower, or by shoveling or in any other manner.”



If you have any questions about any ordinances you can look them up on our website or stop in the borough office and one of the secretaries will be able to help you.



PAVILION RENTAL

If you are looking for a place to hold your family reunion or a graduation party you could rent the pavilion at our Recreation Center at 215 Lincoln Avenue. There is \$100.00 security deposit due when you sign the agreement. The date will be held once we receive the signed agreement and security deposit. We listened to your comments about the rental fee being too high therefore Walnutport Borough Council decided to lower the fee from \$175.00 to \$125.00!!!! The rental fee of \$125.00 is due 2 weeks before your rental date.



The pavilion rental includes the use of the handicapped accessible restrooms and the kitchen area. The security deposit will be returned to you once the pavilion is cleaned and inspected and there is no damages. For more information or to rent the pavilion stop by the borough office and the secretaries will be able to help you.


A NOTE FROM THE WALNUTPORT PLAYGROUND ASSOCIATION'S TREASURER BOB TRESKOT

This board only meets when their UCC permit is denied or if they are sent a violation of the IPMC. Please send a letter of interest to the borough office.

VACANCY BOARD

Are you a registered voter? So you live in the Borough of Walnutport? If you said yes to both of those questions you qualify to be on the Vacancy Board. What is the Vacancy Board? What do they do? You would be responsible to find someone to fill a vacancy on borough council. That means if someone resigns from council, you would reach out to the residents in town and help find someone to fill that seat...or you could put in for that vacant seat. BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY

The likelihood that you and your family will survive a house fire depends on having a working smoke detector and an exit strategy. The same is true for surviving other emergencies. Plan on having the tools and plans in place if disaster should strike.

Get a Kit of Emergency Supplies:

- Water, one gallon per person per day
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Filter mask or cotton t-shirt to filter air
- Moist towelettes for sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape
- Garbage bags and plastic ties
- Unique family needs, such as daily prescription medications, infant formula, important family documents

New Street to Third Avenue: Thursdays

(Includes Lehigh Gap Street)

Dates are subject to change without notice due to inclement weather!

If times permits, we will pick up on non scheduled days.

Leaves are to be raked into the street along the curbing.
(Preferably, line leaves along curb instead of one big pile)

No debris including branches and twigs will be accepted.


Please be courteous to other residents (and street department) by not parking in front or behind of someone's leaf piles.



Generator Safety

Downed utility lines, power company blackouts, heavy snow falls or summer storms can all lead to power outages. Many people turn to a portable generator for a temporary solution without knowing the risks.

- » Generators should be used in well ventilated locations outside away from all doors, windows and vent openings.
- » Never use a generator in an attached garage, even with the door open.
- » Place generators so that exhaust fumes can't enter the home through windows, doors or other openings in the building.
- » Make sure to install carbon monoxide (CO) alarms in your home. Follow manufacturer's instructions for correct placement and mounting height.
- » Turn off generators and let them cool down before refueling. Never refuel a generator while it is running.



- » Store fuel for the generator in a container that is intended for the purpose and is correctly labeled as such. Store the containers outside of living areas.

Just Remember...

When plugging in appliances, make sure they are plugged directly into the generator or a heavy duty outdoor-rated extension cord. The cords should be checked for cuts, tears and that the plug has all three prongs, especially a grounding pin.

If you must connect the generator to the house wiring to power appliances, have a qualified electrician install a properly rated transfer switch in accordance with the National Electrical Code® (NEC) and all applicable state and local electrical codes.

- ! CO deaths associated with generators have spiked in recent years as generator sales have risen.


