STORM WATER MANAGEMENT

Storm water management is a critical part of keeping our water safe and clean and curtailing flooding.

It's not just a job for government or large construction sites; we all can help keep the water clean by following rules, avoiding pollutants and making sure our water goes where it is supposed to when it rains.

In Walnutport, we have what's called a municipal separate storm sewer system (also called MS4 for short). That means our storm water doesn't go down the same drains as sewage from our bathrooms, kitchens and laundry rooms. Our storm water drains directly to the Lehigh Canal and Lehigh River.

Homeowners and businesses can do their part by:

- Keeping your lawn 3 inches high or higher and only mowing 1/3 of the blade each time you mow creates a healthy lawn. A healthy lawn tolerates dry, hot weather better. This way you won't need to spend your summer fertilizing and watering your lawn.
- Leaves – never rake into or near storm sewers. Leaves and grass clippings are good fertilizer for your lawn. Mulch leaves and grass clippings into your lawn.
- Household hazardous waste – put it where it belongs – not down the drain, in the trash or on the ground. Call the county recycling office for guidance on household hazardous waste disposal.
- Rain washes pet waste and bacteria into our storm drains. Please dispose of in the trash.
- Leaking gasoline or oil from your automobile washes from streets, driveways, parking lots into storm drains and rivers. Fix leaks, be careful when getting gas, and don't pour the old oil from oil changes onto gravel roads or driveways.
- When fertilizing your lawn, excess fertilizer will be washed off during rain storms and go directly to our community's storm sewer system. This causes algae growth and which uses up the oxygen that fish need to survive. Please follow directions and don't over fertilize.
- When washing your car at home, remember all the dirt washes down the driveway to our storm drains. This dirt is pollution. Avoid this by washing cars on gravel or grass or better yet use a commercial car wash where the water is recycled and gets treated.

A NOTE FROM THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ERIC STROHL

Ordinance 2012-08 section 219-1. Vegetative growth a nuisance under certain conditions.



No person, firm or corporation, owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Walnutport shall permit any grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed a height of

12 inches, or to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor, or to conceal any filthy deposit, or to create or produce pollen. Any grass, weeds or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough of Walnutport in violation of any of the provisions of this section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough of Walnutport.

We would like to remind you that when you cut your grass, don't blow the clippings into the street. Those clippings end up building up and blocking the storm drains. Keeping the storm drains clear of debris help prevent flooding when we get a rain storm.

Ordinance 2012-08 section 141-1 "Building Number-A Safety Issue".

"The houses, stores and other buildings being or fronting on any of the public streets or alleys of the Borough shall be numbered in the manner hereinafter provided, and the owner or owners thereof shall be required to place numbers plainly faced upon the front of any such house, store or other building. The numbers shall be plain and distinct and shall be of figures at least three inches in height, to be securely fastened to the door frame or on transoms over the door or on the front of the building in such a manner as to be easily seen from the adjoining public street or alley."

This ordinance is for the safety of everyone. We want to make sure if there is an emergency at your house or business the emergency personnel can find your house or business as soon as possible. We also ask that you keep your shrubbery, flowers, trees or whatever else away from the numbers so they can be visible to the street.

If you have any questions about any ordinances you can look them up on our website or stop in the borough office and one of the secretaries will be able to help you.

WALNUTPORT AUTHORITY REPORT – RONALD KUNTZ, CHAIRMAN

Just a reminder again that the Walnutport Authority has a web page. You can log in to this site at www.walnutportauthority.org to view the most recent Consumer Confidence Report (water quality report), public notices, and contact information and water and sewer rates. Also listed on the web site is a brief history of the Authority and the Officers and board members. The recent consumer confidence report is also available in the Authority office, at Borough Hall, or by calling 610-767-7887.

If you have a water emergency when our office is closed or unavailable, you should call the police non-emergency number at 610-437-5252.

The Authority has an after-hours drop box located at the entrance to our building. We ask you to identify your payment with "water and /or sewer" to insure proper handling of your payment. Please be sure to provide us with your phone number so that we can get important messages to you when it becomes necessary.

The Authority asks all residents to have their water meter

readout clear for meter readers to access. Keep all bushes and plants trimmed or away from this area. Please consider this when installing fencing or shrubbery and call our office at 610 767 7887 if you are not sure where your water meter readout is located.



The new water line on First Avenue was completed and new road surface was constructed. We are in the process of applying for grants to replace a water line on south Lincoln Ave, and to install a water line under the Canal from Lehigh Street to South Canal Street. We did get positive feedback from the grant committee that they felt this is a viable project.

We have begun installing radio reads on the outside of your home where the previous readout is located. The installation of radio reads will be completed in stages due to the cost and time constraints.

Smoke Alarm Statistics

Although smoke alarms are present in 96% of American Homes, 19% do not work, mostly because of dead or missing batteries. This means roughly 25 million homes are at risk because of non-working smoke alarms and an additional 4.5 million homes are at risk of not having smoke alarms. This prevents the U.S. from achieving the full potential of increased fire safety from smoke alarms.

In the U.S. roughly 80% of fire deaths result from fires in homes without working smoke alarms. Half of the home fire deaths resulted from fires in the small percentage of homes (five percent) without any smoke alarms.

The rental fee of \$125.00 is due 2 weeks before your rental date. The pavilion rental includes the use of the handicapped accessible restrooms and the kitchen area. The security deposit will be returned to you once the pavilion is cleaned and inspected and there is no damages. UCC & PROPERTY MAINTENANCE APPEAL BOARD

If you have experience and knowledge in the UCC (building code) or International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) we need you to sit on our appeal board. This board only meets when their UCC permit is denied or if they are sent a violation of the IPMC. Please send a letter of interest to the borough office.

A NOTE FROM CHIEF PETER WAYDA

Do you know when to call 9-1-1?

When non-emergency calls compete with true emergencies it can cause delays in services. Do you know when to call 9-1-1 versus the local non-emergency phone number?

Your local non-emergency number should be used when immediate dispatch of the police is not required because some time has elapsed since the incident occurred, the suspect is no longer at the scene of the crime, or if you are calling about a nuisance issue (e.g. barking dogs).

Calling 9-1-1 for a non-emergency situation ties up important lifelines meant for people or property in immediate jeopardy or when there is a crime in progress. If you call 9-1-1 for a non-emergency matter, it will not result in a faster response. Emergency situations are always given priority over situations where people response is not urgent or time sensitive and emergency operators will not take non-emergency reports on 9-1-1.

When to call 9-1-1

9-1-1 is for police, fire, or medical emergencies when immediate action is required: someone's health, safety or property is in jeopardy or a crime is in progress.

Examples of when to call 9-1-1:

- An event that involves an immediate threat to a person or property: attacks, gunshots, fire, car accident with injuries or any other medical emergency.

• A substantive in-progress crime. This includes fights, breaks and enters (if there is a suspect on scene) or a report of an impaired driver.

- A serious crime that just occurred (e.g. assault, robbery)
- A suspicious circumstance that may indicate an imminent criminal act (e.g. prowler, vandal)

Examples of non-emergency calls:

- Reporting a crime with no suspect (e.g. theft of a license plate)
- Reporting a crime with suspect, but suspect is not on the scene (e.g. fraud)
- Reporting a serious crime with suspect, but with a lengthy delay (e.g. assault that occurred last night).
- Non-emergency in progress (e.g. noisy party, drug use)
- On-going crime issues or crimes that are not in progress.




