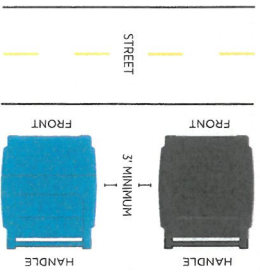

RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS ONLY
**CURBSIDE CONTAINER
 PLACEMENT GUIDE**
 Place containers at the curb the night before pickup day.

PROPER CONTAINER PLACEMENT



Put containers on a hard, level surface clear of obstructions such as snow, landscaping, mailboxes, and utility poles. Do not block the sidewalk.

CONTAINER DON'TS

Containers must remain upright and forward facing for pickup	Keep all materials inside the container with the lid closed	Do not place containers back to back	Keep container clear of all obstructions

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Zero-Sort® recycling?

Zero-Sort recycling is Casella's state-of-the-art single stream recycling process which enables paper, cardboard, plastic, glass, and metal cans to be collected together in one bin eliminating the need for you to separate recyclables. Trash doesn't belong in this bin.

How should I prepare recyclables?

Recyclables must be empty and rinsed clean of food residue. Corrugated cardboard boxes should be broken down into 2' max pieces.

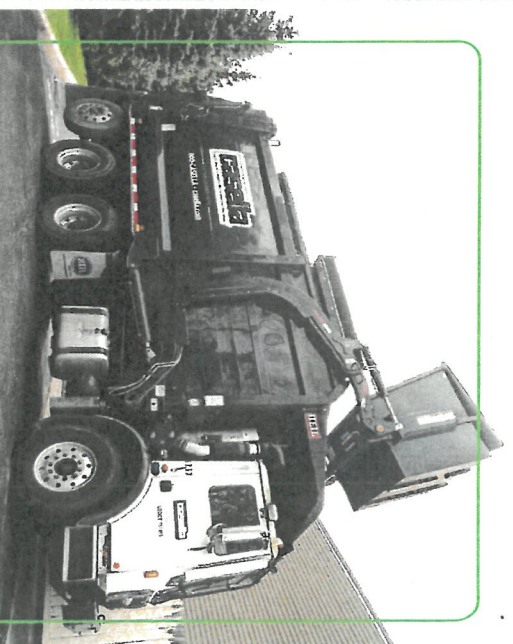
Can I throw batteries into my trash or recycling bin?

NO. Placing batteries in your trash or recycling bin is dangerous for both waste workers and emergency responders. Ensure safe and proper disposal by recycling your household batteries at any Call2Recycle drop-off center. To find a location near you, visit call2recycle.org/locator - it's easy and free!

How should I discard of large items that won't fit inside my bin?

ONE bulk item will be collected on the 3rd Monday of each month.

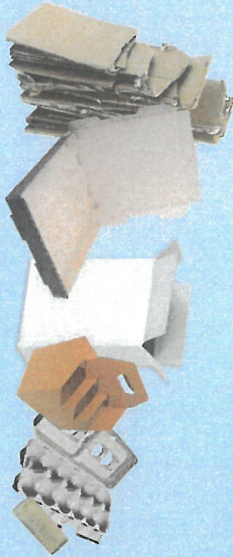




RECYCLING

Plastic Bottles, Jugs, Tubs & Lids
(Empty kitchen, laundry, & bath containers & clamshells)



Aluminum & Steel Cans
(Foil & empty food & beverage cans)



Glass Bottles & Jars
(Empty food & beverage bottles & jars)

✓ No items smaller than 2" in size

✓ All containers are empty, rinsed, & dry

✓ Cardboard is flattened & broken down

✓ There are **NO** items from the **NOT ACCEPTED** list in the recycling bin
